- Test your smoke alarms and tell guests about your home fire escape plan.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop.
- All heaters need space. Keep things that can burn, such as paper, bedding or furniture, at least 3 feet away from heating equipment.
- · If you smoke, smoke outside
- · If your clothes catch on fire Stop Drop and Roll.
- · If there is an emergency call 911 we are here to help.

Plan your escape around your abilities – for older adults, consider subscribing to a medical alert system, which will provide you with a button to wear around your neck or wrist. Keep the phone, a flashlight and whistle by your bed to signal for help.
