

Weatherization Education Outreach Program

(WEOP) helps lower energy costs for income eligible households.

Since 2013, over 83 homes have received assistance from the WEOP program. More than half of those homes have seen their energy consumption reduced by 22% and water consumption reduced by 28%.

Weatherization Works!

A no-cost weatherization may include:

- Inspection of central HVAC systems
- Attic insulation installed up to R-38
- LED bulbs (max of 8)
- Programmable thermostat, if applicable
- Door/Window inspection/replacement
- Installation of low-flow showerheads and aerators
- Inspection/replacement of water heater

How the program works:

1. Submit an application to determine program eligibility.
2. An energy survey of the home is conducted to identify needs.
3. The home is weatherized.
4. Home is inspected to assure quality of work completed.

1 NOTIFY

Notify your local one-call center by calling 811 or making an online request 2-3 days before work begins. For information about our local one-call center and online service availability, please visit www.sunshine811.com. The one-call center will transmit information to affected utility operators.



2 WAIT

Wait 2-3 days (varies by state; please visit www.sunshine811.com for state law information) for affected utility operators to respond to your request. On average, between 7-8 utility operators are notified for each request.

3 CONFIRM

Confirm that all affected utility operators have responded to your request by comparing the marks to the list of utilities the one-call center notified. State laws vary on the process for confirmation; please check with your one-call center for more information.



4 RESPECT

Respect the marks. The marks provided by the affected utility operators are your guide for the duration of your project. If you are unable to maintain the marks during your project, or the project will continue past your request's expiration date (varies by state), please call 811 to ask for a re-mark.

5 DIG CAREFULLY

Dig carefully. If you can't avoid digging near the marks (within 18-24 inches on all sides, depending on state law), consider moving your project to another part of your yard. If you must dig near the marks or use machinery of any kind, please visit www.call811.com to read "The 811 Process for Contractors."
